### FALL WATER LINE FLUSHING

Fall water line flushing will be taking place October 5<sup>th</sup> – October 9<sup>th</sup>, dependant on weather conditions. Please watch the community sign and the local newspaper for any changes.

### YARD DEBRIS ON PRIVATE AND PUBLIC PROPERTY

Please be advised that grass clippings, leaves and yard debris are not to be dumped on public or private property within Town. This type of material is to be taken to the Regional Landfill.

### GARBAGE PICK UP

Those residents who have been instructed to move garbage for winter pickup from the back alleys to the front of your property are reminded to do so as of November 2<sup>nd</sup>, 2015. If you are unsure if you are to move your garbage, please call the Town Office at 547-2810.

### PRWMA REGIONAL LANDFILL

The Regional Landfill Site, located west of Town at SE-4-35-6-W2nd in the RM of Preeceville is open every Tuesday and Thursday from 3:00 pm to 7:00 pm until October 1<sup>st</sup> and then will change to 2:00 pm to 5:00 pm for winter hours.
